A Journey of Growth and Empowerment





Met with the challenges of the 2020 pandemic, EXP rose to the occasion by swiftly pivoting the *EXP Internship Program: Powered by Prologis* into a virtual experience. This presented Jama Willis, a junior enrolled in the Mojave Express Logistics Academy at Barstow High School, with a unique opportunity to embark on a transformative summer internship at California State Assemblymember Mike Gipson's district office in Gardena.

For Jama, a first-generation Black indigenous immigrant from Jamaica, this opportunity was life-altering. Throughout the internship, he cultivated a profound appreciation for the power of public service and advocacy, setting the stage for his academic and professional journey ahead.

Ms. Patty [Negrette] said to take every opportunity and advice given by EXP mentors and run with it, and I've taken that to heart especially when it comes to networking.

Jama went on to attend Harvard University in the fall of 2021 and pursued a joint concentration in Government and African and African American Studies. Building on his EXP experiences and his networking skills, he further honed his skills through non-legal internships with the US Department of Justice and the Harvard Undergraduate Foreign Policy Initiative.

Currently, Jama is enjoying his final semester abroad at St. Catherine's College, Oxford University, and looking forward to his summer internship at the Foreign Service office at the Trinidad and Tobago Embassy, alongside fieldwork in Jamaica and Barbados.

Jama's remarkable journey epitomizes the profound impact of community support provided by the EXP program. Leveraging education, experience, and networks, Jama not only shapes himself into a future leader but also empowers himself to enact meaningful change in his communities and beyond.

BARSTOW: ON TRACK TO SUCCESS

In partnership with BNSF Railway, EXP expanded our reach from the LA Harbor to the High Desert in 2008 by establishing the Mojave Express Logistics Academy (MXP) at Barstow High School to strengthen transportation career-based programs. We have been on track to success in Barstow ever since.

In the capable hands of Senior Program Manager Patty Negrette, EXP programs have become the gateway to student success and received full support from the local community.

\$100K Grant from BNSF

In October 2022, BNSF presented EXP with a \$100,000 grant to support our programs at Barstow and Central High Schools over the next four years. This transformative contribution will enable EXP to help every single student get access to high-wage, high-growth jobs and careers in the transportation industry.

Barstow HS's Mojave Express Logistics Academy Career Fair

In April 2023, nearly **1,450 students** attended this 12th annual event, where they connected with more than **80 volunteers** from more than **20 employers** to explore career possibilities. Juniors also participated in mock interviews during the fair.

Internship Program Growth

EXP Internship Program continues to grow in popularity with students and earns support from the local business community year after year. Student participation has grown **80%** since 2018.






Expenses Breakdown

EXP and Prologis Prepare the Next Generation Workforce





In 2018, EXP and Prologis announced an innovative workforce development partnership designed to revitalize logistics career pathways and invest in local communities. Building on the foundation of the internship program already established in 2001, the EXP Internship Program: Powered by Prologis now includes job-readiness training workshops, industry mentoring, and career exploration activities, culminating in a four-to six-week paid summer internship.

Since our partnership began, we have placed **520 high school students** in local internships and increased numbers of logistics internship hosts by leveraging Prologis' market share.

"We heard tremendous feedback from our customers who volunteer their companies to be part of the internship program," said Kim Snyder, West Region President, Prologis. "Exposure to young people in their offices revitalizes their energy."

"The internship program added great value to our team," said Jay Patel, President, Westcoast Warehousing, a Prologis customer and an EXP internship host. "After the interns were finished...our team took on the training of our own employees. It reinforced them to get trained."

We are grateful to Prologis for their commitment to growing regional talent, strengthening our community, and helping high school students gain professional competence and personal confidence.
